DAILY ITINERARY

DAY 1 : Home to Fremantle (D)

Starting your day the Tour Local way, we make our way to the Airport, where our flight out west awaits. Arriving into Perth, we make our short hop to Fremantle, where you are able to unpack and relax for the next 3 nights! We have chosen Fremantle over Perth, as both the beautiful architecture; the historical significance; and the slower, more relaxed vibe here provides a perfect atmosphere for us to enjoy ourselves for the next few days. STAY: Fremantle— Rydges on the Esplanade (or similar)

DAY 2 : Fremantle—Rottnest Island (B, L, D)

Enjoy a full day tour out to Rottnest Island today—as we are guided around this scenic island, visiting some of the historic sights, riding on the historic train, and enjoying the sights and a lunch, before returning to the mainland.

STAY: Fremantle— Rydges on the Esplanade (or similar)

DAY 3 : Fremantle (B, D)

This is your day to relax and do with what you will. We will have the coach ready to go for those who feel like still doing a bit of travelling—maybe start with a Fremantle City sights tour, or come with us into Perth and head up to Kings Park. Or simply sit by the pool, enjoy the beach, or put your feet up and do nothing.

STAY: Fremantle— Rydges on the Esplanade (or similar)

DAY 4 : Fremantle to Busselton (B, L, D)

Leaving Fremantle behind, we take the scenic route further down the western coast, arriving into Bunbury in time for lunch at the Dolphin Centre—where you'll have a chance to view some of these friendly sea-mammals. After lunch, we make our way into Busselton, where we will unpack for two nights, but not before we take the famed train down the longest timber-piled jetty in the country!

STAY: Busselton — Abbey Beach (or similar)

DAY 5 : Busselton: Margaret River (B, L, D)

A full day of touring awaits today, as we make our way out to the Cape Naturalist Lighthouse– standing on the north-western point of southern WA. From here, we marvel at the naturally formed cave systems that stretch throughout this region, before taking in the Birds of Prey show at the Eagle Heritage Centre. Having well-earned it, we settle in for some wine and cheese at one of Margaret River's finest establishments.

STAY: Busselton — Abbey Beach (or similar)

DAY 6 : Busselton to Albany (B, L, D)

We set out through the scenic drive through the Boranup Forest to start our journey today, soon arriving into Leeuwin Lighthouse—the location where the Indian and Southern Oceans meet. Setting our sights inland (just slightly) we arrive into Pemberton for lunch, before traversing the mighty giant trees at the Valley of the Giants Tree Top Walk.

Unpack in Albany for two nights, enjoying the splendours of Australia's first Euro settlement town.

STAY: Albany — Hilton Garden (or similar)

DAY 7 : Albany: Touring (B, D)

It's a bit of a relaxed day today, as we start it by taking the short hop out to the Gap—a naturally occurring rock formation, looking out over the vast southern ocean. We then take the memorial/fort drive around the central part of Albany, discovering the maritime and military significance of this area, before finishing at the National ANZAC Centre. After some time here to explore, we will take you into the main street of Albany, where you will have some free time to do as you please—being within walking distance of both our hotel, and the amazing beaches, you will surely enjoy an afternoon at leisure here.

STAY: Albany — Hilton Garden (or similar)

DAY 8 : Albany to Esperance (B, L, D)

Today is a bit of a travel day, but a breathtaking one at that. Enjoy the scenic diver through the Stirling Range as we make our way out of Albany, and set our sights on Esperance. We will stop of lunch at the old outback township of Ravensthorpe—where the weird and whacky await—before arriving into Esperance in the mid-afternoon.

STAY: Esperance — Comfort Inn (or similar)

DAY 9 : Esperance: Touring (B, D)

Enjoy a morning cruise in among the island of Esperance to start your day today. Not only will you be mesmerised by the glistening turquoise waters of the southern coast, but you'll witness as plenty of native wildlife frolic around you in this natural paradise. Following our cruise, we will drive through some of the most idyllic landscapes Australia has to offer, encountering breathtaking beaches, and scenery not often seen, as we journey through Cape Le Grand National Park and beyond. **STAY: Esperance — Comfort Inn (or similar)**

DAY 10 & 11 : Esperance to the Nullarbor—2 Nights (B, D) The journey of a lifetime begins today!

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We travel north for a few 100kms, and then travel east...for quite a while (about 1,200kms). Marvel at the stunning vertical drops of the Bunda Cliffs; enjoy a hit of Golf on the longest Golf Course in the world; spot the ancient ruins of the Old Telegraph Station in Eucla; get a photo at the Nullarbor Sign; enjoy the far horizon, and the endless sky of stars—a true beauty awaits. STAY: Balladonia Motel & Nullarbor Hotel—we aim for the best accommodation available to us.

DAY 12 : The Nullarbor to Ceduna (B, D)

Dust yourself off, as we arrive back into civilisation (sort of), making our way into Ceduna in the early afternoon, finishing our journey along the Nullarbor. We will visit the national trust museum here, and enjoy a beautiful sunset across the bight. STAY: Ceduna— Foreshore Hotel





DAY 13 : Ceduna to Port Lincoln (B, D)

We traverse the western coastline of the Eyre Peninsula today, stopping along the way at Streaky Bay and Elliston; before arriving in the early afternoon into Port Lincoln. We will visit the Maritime Museum to gain a better understanding of the history and significance of this area, before checking into our hotel for the next two nights.

STAY: Port Lincoln — Port Lincoln Hotel (or similar)

DAY 14 : Port Lincoln: Touring (B, L, D)

Our first stop today is out on the western side of the Peninsula, at the award wining Coffin Bay Oyster Farm Experience Tour. Cruise the crystal blue waters of Coffin Bay, enjoying some fresh oysters as you go, and learning about the industry that has made this area so famous. We take the short hop back to the east side of the Peninsula, where a delicious wine tasting awaits us to see in the golden hour of the afternoon. Spend some time relaxing at our accommodation, located right in the heart of port Lincoln, overlooking the Spencer Gulf.

STAY: Port Lincoln – Port Lincoln Hotel (or similar)

DAY 15 : Port Lincoln to Wallaroo (B, L, D)

We bid farewell to the Eyre Peninsula today, as we journey up the eastern coast, stopping in at Tumby Bay along the way, and boarding our ferry our of Lucky Bay. This will take us directly across the Spencer Gulf, where you will be blesses with beautiful views as we cruise across to the Yorke Peninsula. Arriving midafternoon, we make the short hop down to Moonta Bay, where we take a step back in time at the Moonta Bay Mines Museum and Railway.

STAY: Wallaroo—Marina Apartments (or similar)

DAY 16 : Wallaroo to Home (B)

Las, all good things must come to an end—and today is that day. We will leave the Yorke Peninsula behind us, journeying out of the copper coast, through Kadina and Port Wakefield, and into Adelaide, where your plane home awaits.
